BOARD MEMBER'S MESSAGE

AUTOBAHN DRIVING

Mercedes-Benz autos are designed to be driven at their top speed on the Autobahn, as road conditions and driving skill permit. The Autobahn can provide an enjoyable experience for Americans, provided you approach it with respect, as German drivers do who are required to learn this by attending a comprehensive driving school followed by a rigorous and demanding driving test.

German drivers are very disciplined to drive on the right unless passing, then moving back into the right lane immediately after passing. Unfortunately, even though there are still long stretches of German Autobahn without speed limits, traffic often slows you down. Autobahn speed limits are shown by a number in a circular sign, usually on both sides of the highway. That remains the limit, unless another speed number is shown further down the road.

On sections with heavy truck traffic, the right lane is essentially limited to their speed of about 100-110 kmh (160 kmh = 100 mph). You must always look very far ahead when driving fast, anticipating the need to slow to 100 in seconds if a truck pulls out into the fast lane to pass a slower truck. At the same time, you need to check your rearview mirror regularly while in the fast lane, so that you can see the Porsche, Ferrari, or SLS that is overtaking your 180 kmh by 50 kmh or more. Courtesy (and the law) requires you to move over to let the faster traffic pass you.

Road repair sections are announced by speeds slowing to 100, then to 80, then to 60, to allow all the traffic to be squeezed into narrow lanes on one side of the highway, while repairs are underway on the other side. Residents in some cities have gotten speeds reduced so that the noise level is lowered. In those areas you will see the speed sign 120 or 100 "Lärmschutz." You may encounter speed signs of 100 or 80 "bei Nässe." You can ignore those limits unless the road is wet in these areas that could result in hydroplaning. When past the reduced speed section, a blank circular sign tells you that all previous speed limits are removed.

Hidden remote flash cameras to catch speeders are often located in reduced speed areas. They are set to simultaneously capture the driver's face, the license plate, and the speed. Police are vigilant and will cite drivers for following too closely, passing unsafely, particularly at high speeds, or failing to keep to the right. Autobahns are kept in very good repair, so you don't have to worry about hitting a pothole at high speed. Be attentive. Drive carefully and safely, and you will enjoy your Autobahn experience.

In recent trips to Germany we have reserved mid-sized autos, and either were upgraded or negotiated to pay a few more € per day for a larger car. Because European cars are taxed highly for bigger engines, and because fuel costs are about double that in the U.S., most cars in rental fleets have relatively small engines by U.S. standards. But that doesn't mean underpowered or slow. Our last rental was an E-220, which cruised enjoyably at 225 kmh on a relatively empty Autobahn in Bavaria.

Consider buying a Mercedes-Benz to pick up at the factory, or visit Germany and rent a Mercedes-Benz model such as the economical A- or B-Class that isn't available in the U.S.
